



HOLIDAY DECORATION REMINDERS

- 
- A string of colorful holiday lights (red, green, blue, yellow) hanging horizontally across the top of the page.
- Use UL-approved lighting strands
 - Use only artificial, fire-retardant trees if decorating trees with lights
 - Replace burned out bulbs right away with the correct wattage bulbs
 - Check all lighting strands for cracked cords, frayed ends or loose connections
 - Keep lighting strands somewhat taught to help minimize strangulation hazards
 - Use only exterior rated light strands for outdoor lighting
 - Use a Ground Fault Circuit Interrupter (GFCI) electrical outlet where water is present, or if using lights outside
 - Use insulated hooks and NOT metal tacks, nails or screws to hang lights
 - Unplug ALL lighting strands when leaving an area unattended
 - Use an approved fiberglass or wooden ladder when hanging light strands; NEVER use a chair or table to reach heights
 - Ensure artwork or materials that hang from the ceiling are NOT near lighting fixtures or DO NOT come in contact with combustible materials and/or furniture
 - Hang artwork on walls following the NFPA standards (NFPA 101 Life Safety Code):
“You may cover up to 20% of the wall area for a non-sprinkled building; up to 50% of the wall area for a sprinkled building”
